Who's Watching Other than the Commission?

Labor Groups & interested parties have been questioning contracts since before the first online meeting records of 2008. Any Agency, any issue of non-compliance.

Bidders with Standing

Interested Parties

Associations/Unions Representing those with Standing

General Public/Other

- Board/BOC
- Newspapers
- Voters/Neighbors/Parents



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The Construction Industry Force Account Council (CIFAC) is a non-profit organization that represents contractors, contractor associations and the various building trades. As such, we meet the definition of an "interested party" per Public Contract Code Section 22042.

Why? More are opting into this hard bid exception = More scrutiny!

Started in 1983 – Accounting for Force Account Labor was laborious.

Major revamp in 2008 and more as time moved on to streamline

and simplify the use of the Act

Agency trends moved to outsourcing

- In 27 years (2010), only 736 agencies had opted in
- Since 2019 an average of 16 - K-12 School Districts & 4 - Cities join EACH commission meeting!



Since 2010 1,584 are in!

(nearly doubled

MOST COMMON ISSUES

Some Common Mistakes

Mostly for Agencies who do projects with internal forces.

Force Account Overages

Bid Splitting

Splitting up a "Project" into small contracts *thus* avoiding a higher level of bidding.

Say, getting quotes, each part under \$60k, but all parts adding up to over \$60k and all for the same project.

For instance, quotes were obtained when an informal bid was required.



The Spotlight: Typical Process



Challenger
(Labor Group or
Interested Party)
initiates contact &
asks for records

Staff investigates and gathers all responsive materials

a letter with
backup to
CUCCAC asking
for a review

Challenger, District, perhaps District's legal counsel, and commissioners review in a public session all claims and make one or more public findings

2021 Edition

22044.5 Compliance; Removal from Act If the commission makes a finding, in accordance with section 22043, on three separate occasions within a 10-year period, that the work undertaken by a public agency falls within any of the categories described in section 22042, the commission shall notify the public agency of that finding in writing by certified mail and the public agency shall not use the bidding procedures provided by this article for five years from the date of the commission's findings.

Let's Look at a Couple of Interesting Accounting Reviews

Case 1: Lack of Scoping & Estimating Leads to Using the Wrong Procurement Process (Under \$60k instead of Informal)


Invited 3 but didn't notify their list

Community Services staff worked with Police Department staff to develop specifications for a security gate that would meet the needs of the Department. Community Services staff walked the project with **three potential bidders and requested they submit bids. Commercial Door Company, Inc. submitted

Someone on the list got concerned & contacted the agency with their issue.

That person also notified CIFAC.

Case 2: Lack of Scoping & Estimating Leads to Using the Wrong Procurement Process (Under \$60k instead of Informal)



At the public review, the agency conceded that they had errored by not using the Informal process for the awards.

The Commission made a finding against the agency. (Jan 2023)

- Remind folks that the Agency "opted in" to work within a <u>legal exception</u> to formal hard bidding for construction over \$15k.
 It's a privilege that can be revoked.
- The <u>rules are clear</u> and not hard to do, & <u>folks are watching</u>. Compliance is far better than going back to the \$15k bid limit!
- Hold annual staff training.
 All departments that hire licensed contractors, including I.T.

Project (all contracts)





Have templates & authorities ready. If you need some, just ask.

- Quote Package/Contract under \$60k
- Informal Bid/Contract \$60-\$200K
- Formal Bid/Contract over \$200 (typ. Hard Bid template)
- Annual Authority Resolution in place

<u>Don't use your contractors to scope/estimate</u>, or they should not be allowed to provide a quote or bid – likely conflict of interest!

If staff can't do scoping & lite estimating sufficient for compliance, consider getting a consultant/architect under contract who can do so cheaply and quickly.

More ideas...

If in doubt, bid it out!

- It's not a big deal if you have the tools & training in place
- If it is close to a limit, go with the next higher process

Sneak Peak -Pending Changes

DRAFT Code Redline Highlights – Pending Legislative Approval

Proposed Changes in Levels

- 1. *Under \$70k by Force Account
- 2. Under \$60k \$100k negotiated
- 3. Under \$200k \$220k by informal bid
- 4. Bids that go over informal limit can be awarded up to a max of \$220k \$235k

Proposed Oversight Language Additions

- 1. Bid Splitting Section 22033
- 2. Exceeded limits or not met requirements of Section 22032 (b), (c) and (d)


